Students pursuing positions in cultural resource management (i.e. historic site management, curation, cultural resource interpretation) are strongly advised to take courses in Anthropology & History.

Remember!

- ◆ You are required to make an appointment with your advisor well in advance of the beginning of registration each semester.

- ◆ *You must* make an appointment for graduation in the Registrar's Office at least three semester before you anticipate completion of degree requirements.
